

Dear Parents/Carers,

It was lovely to welcome the children back after the half term break this week, with lots going on as always! Year 3 have started their block of swimming lessons, new units and topics of work have been started and we have launched our new Christian Value 'Justice' this week too!

Justice

'For the LORD is righteous, he loves Justice. Upright men will see his face.' Psalm 11:7

For our worship this week we have been thinking about whether justice is always about treating everyone exactly the same, or if it's a bit more complicated than that. In school, at home and within our community, it is not always possible or **fair** to treat everyone the same. However, we can do our very best to make sure everyone has what they **NEED** and to be content.



School Uniform

I have spoken to each class this week about making sure we are ready for school each day, including wearing the correct uniform and having the right equipment so we are ready to make the most of every minute. All children in Years 1 and above should be wearing a school tie with their uniform. We have noticed in the week leading up to the half term break that some children were missing a tie, and some starting to wear trainers, boots and different coloured footwear rather than the black shoes as stated in our uniform policy. Can I please ask that you also name all uniform, so that we can get it back to its rightful owner as quickly as possible. As the weather gets warmer, children discard jumpers, cardigans and blazers and without names, these end up in lost property boxes and lost.


World Book Day—Thursday 6th March

Understanding your child: from toddler to teenager FREE online workshop for parents and carers in Cheshire East.



About this course

No matter your family setup, the important relationships in your child's life help shape their emotional health and wellbeing. This transformative course offers a reflective space to think about your child's development, their behaviour and how they are communicating.

Understanding your child: from toddler to teenager is for all parents, grandparents and carers of children aged between six months to 19 years. The resources are tailored so that whatever their age, you can use the ideas and techniques to help better understand your child, their emotions and how to nurture them.

Family hub drop in sessions

Cheshire East Educational Psychology Team are now offering parent/carer drop-in sessions within the Family Hubs across Cheshire East. These are informal opportunities for parents to discuss concerns, seek advice and explore support strategies for your child. Parents are able to book a 30-minute slot at the drop ins. The afternoon sessions will coincide with Little Stars stay and play sessions for children with SEN.

The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering parent/carer drop-in sessions at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held once per half term in both the North and South localities. These informal sessions are an opportunity to discuss concerns, seek advice, and explore strategies to support your child. They are not for Local Authority processes (e.g., EHCPs or placement changes) or child assessments.

Examples of topics include:

- · Concerns about speech development
 - · Managing challenging behaviours
 - · Social skills or play difficulties
 - · Anxiety or school-related issues
 - · Preparing for adulthood

Parents/carers can book a 30-minute slot by calling their local Family Hub. Sessions will be themed based on age groups (e.g., Start for Life, Primary, Secondary/Post-16) to align with the Family Hub journey map. Afternoon sessions will coincide with the Little Stars stay-and-play group for children with SEN.
